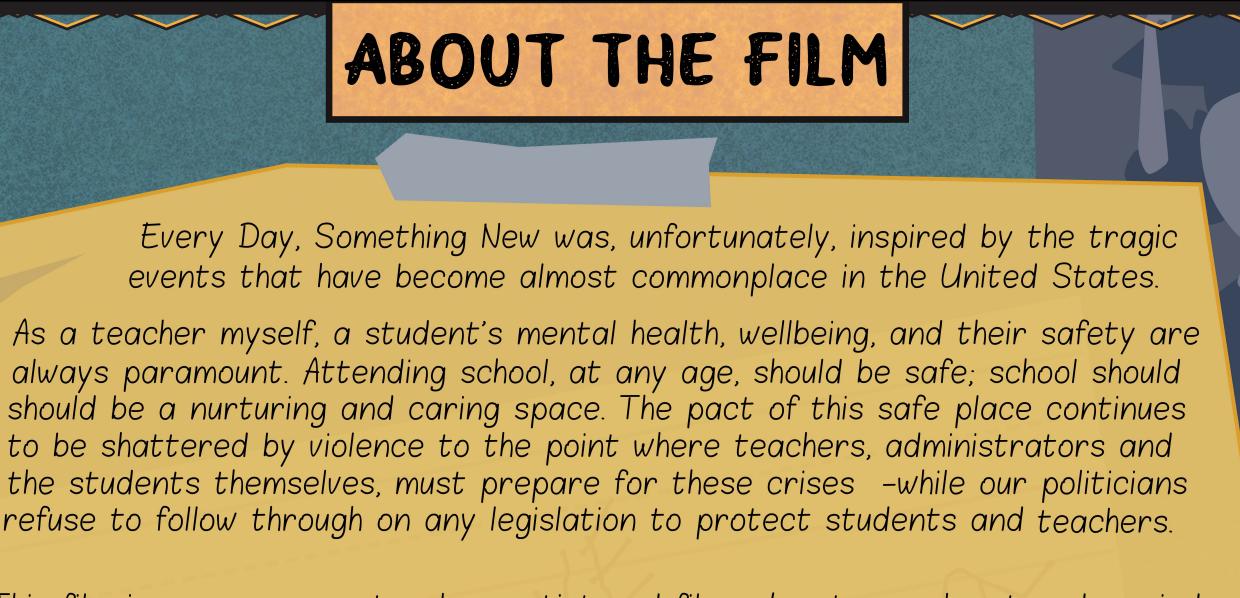
With the newspaper taken inside, she takes a seat to read with her coffee...
